- 15- Thus when you face undeserved suffering you are enabled to stand fast because of the confidence you have regarding the third hope: your eternal future is secure.
- 16- Although circumstances may arise which place you between Scylla and Charybdis, you have knowledge of doctrine to help you make the right choice. *
- 17- Where information is lacking you may resort to prayer and appeal to the supreme court of heaven for direction and guidance in the choices which must be made.
- 18- Utilizing the Biblical problem-solving devices to stabilize your soul, you permit providence to take its course.
- 19- In such a situation your attitude will be that of Joseph Hall's Honest Man: "in all things, good or ill, he respects the nature of the action, not the sequel."¹
- 20- Once you are able to handle the problems in life related to God and self then you are prepared to handle the problems presented by your fellow man.

Honor Code Principle #7: Maintain poise and objectivity when fellow believers malign you. Never make excuses. Never retaliate. Romans 12:

- v 14 = Speak well of those who persecute you; keep on speaking well and do not curse them.
- 1- Sooner or later someone is going to make you the object of their gossip. You are going to be judged and maligned and criticized.
- 2- Their accusation may be the result of false assumptions or the product of sound analysis from all the facts.

- 3- You may be wrong, but you may be right. Either way the circumstances are yours to face and you should not be the topic of vilification from others.
- 4- Nevertheless, this does occur. It is under these conditions that you discover whether or not you buy the idea of God's justice.
- 5- One thing you must learn: you can never make clear to everyone's satisfaction why you did what you did or said what you said.
- 6- Your successes and failures are between you and the Lord, yet often others will make it a point to publicly and personally persecute you in some way because of them.
- 7- God is still in His heaven and Jesus Christ sill sits as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Heaven.
- 8- You must turn these matters over to them for their, prosecution.
- 9- The process and procedure for doing so demands that you habitually speak well of your adversary and never, ever resort to any form of revenge tactics.
- 10- This requires poise, grace and even a sense of humor.
- 11- You may think you have a right to clear your name but to do so you have to create a public spectacle which involves other believers.
- 12- The policy is to let God take care of the details. His integrity insures there will be no miscarriage of justice.
- 13- For you to speak well of your adversary requires that your thinking continue to be controlled by the Holy Spirit with doctrine circulating through the stream of consciousness.
- 14- The outside adversity of persecution is kept outside eliminating any build up of stress in your soul.

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- 15- The key to handling this pressure is to keep your thinking grace oriented. Remember you are dealing with another member of the royal family.
- 16- Doctrinal orientation to reality reminds you that it is a family matter and God will take care of any necessary details.
- 17- Thus as long as your thoughts are objective then you may or may not wish to verbalize praise for your adversary. You may wish to keep silent.
- 18- This approach was the one taken by Joseph Hall's Honest Man, "when his name is traduced, his innocency bears him out with courage: then, lo, he goes on in the plain way of truth, and will either triumph in his integrity, or suffer with it."
 - This approach eliminates use of the adversative conjunction "but": "Oh, I think Fred is the finest Christian gentleman I know but I am afraid that he has the habit of plundering into the affairs of others without any concept of what he is talking about." Or, in street language: "Fred Jones is a believer I know, but in my opinion he is a meddling SOB."
- 20- This is verbal retaliation and is prohibited by the last mandate of the verse, "do not curse them."
- 21- The word for "curse" is KATARAO'MAI and means to imprecate, to wish evil on; to have an antagonistic attitude; to pray against.
- 22- We are not permitted to publicly castigate our fellow believer who persecutes us nor are we allowed the prerogative of praying that God visit misery and suffering upon him.
- 23- Such an attitude indicates you have reacted to outside adversity creating stress in the soul.
- 24- Such an approach indicates you have lowered yourself to the level of your adversary and joined him on the playing field of cosmic warfare.
- 25- From such conflict the body of Christ cannot be restored to harmony or unity.
