David's Heir: Law of Volitional Responsibility: Every Person is Responsible for His Own Decisions; Saul Operated from the Cosmic Systems & Received Constant Discipline as a Result; David Did Likewise, but Confessed His Sins, Ps 51:4; His Discipline Was Designed to Rid Him of Guilt Resulting in Blessings

Law of Volitional Responsibility:

- A. Definition and Description:
- 1. Volition is the decision-maker of the soul. The believer is free to make choices that are in-line with the Word of God or not.
- 2. As a free moral agent, the believer's volition produces thoughts, decisions, and actions for which he is responsible before the Lord.
- Good decisions broaden future options while bad decisions limit future options.
 Our emphasis in this section will be on bad decisions, for which Saul was held accountable.
- 4. Since free will decisions come under the law of volitional responsibility, Saul was responsible for causing his own misery and suffering.
- 5. He fell under the law of divine punitive action by which God disciplined him to remove the guilt caused by his emotional sins and for judging David.
- 6. When divine punishment continues following confession alone to God alone, the purpose is to convert cursing into blessing.
- 7. David was responsible for a list of sins, some of which were grievous crimes that he confessed to God:
 - **Psalm 51:4** Against you and you only, I have sinned and done what is evil in Your sight, so that You are justified when You speak and blameless when You judge. (NASB)
- 8. As a result, David was forgiven, but he was required to endure divine punitive action. This is a process of discipline designed to remove the guilt of his sins.
