- These two attributes together give us the principle that all truth is absolute. V + I = A: Veracity plus Immutability equals Absolutes.
- \mathscr{M} When the believer in Jesus Christ learns the absolute principles of the immutable Scriptures and remains loyal to those standards under pressure he becomes a person of honor.
- Maximum knowledge of absolute principles in the soul of a believer in spiritual adulthood produces an inventory of ideas which is classified as Christian Integrity. The Integrity in action is called probity, or honor. Thregrity is loyalty to truth. When this integrity is manifest through application of truth to experience it becomes a virtue called honor.

III. * Principles of Integrity and Honor:

- 1-Loyalty to the absolute standards of Biblical truth in interpersonal relationships becomes the sine qua non of the royal family honor code. TRUTH (BDKIS) = CHL INT. LOYALTY TO TRUTH = HONOR
- The royal family honor code is a set of standards derived from Scripture by which the believer demonstrates Christian integrity in his relationships with others.
- 3-The honor code is executed within the environment of spiritual self-esteem with emphasis on the problemsolving device of unconditional love. PL >0,55E, UL > mK
- 4-The objective of spiritual growth in the Plan of God is to develop a thought pattern which complements our spiritual aristocracy.
- 5-That thought pattern is reflected in the execution of the royal family honor code in interpersonal relationships.
- 6-The honor code develops right thinking. Right thinking produces right motivation. Right motivation produces right action. Rom 12:21
- 7-The enemy of the honor code is emotional sins, especially the sins of the tongue, such as gossip, maligning, judging, slandering and vilification.
- **B**-These are the verbal explosions which result from soul implosion. 测為多

- 9- One is enabled to reject such cosmic problem solving when he incorporates honor code principles into his soul from the Divine Academy.
- /@- Our passage points out this fact; Ephesians 4:
 - v 25 = Therefore, having laid aside the lie (while simultaneously putting on the truth) each one of you speak truth with his fellow believer, since we are members of one another.
- The lie thus becomes anything which is in violation of the honor code:
 - 1- Violation of the Laws of Divine Establishment.
 - 2- Concepts and ideas which threaten the stability of the four Divine Institutions.
 - 3- Communication of false gospels.
 - 4- Rejection of Biblical mandates.
- 12- "Laying aside the lie" is the recovery process which occurs through the inculcation of Bible doctrine.
- 13- Bible doctrine is the expression of absolute truth from God to man.
- 14- Absolute truth demands honor, which is the reflected virtue of Christian Integrity.
- Absolute truth has no beginning and no ending and thus embodies the unchanging standards of a perfect and righteous God.
- 16- Consequently, violations of the honor code indicate a rejection of absolute truth.
- To the degree absolute truth is rejected there is a corresponding loss of integrity and where there is no integrity there can be no honor.
- 18- British Cavalier poet Richard Loveless expressed the essence of honor in his poem, "To Lucasta, Going to the Wars", written in 1649

Tell me not, sweet, I am unkind, That from the nunnery Of thy chaste breast and quiet mind To war and arms I fly. True, a new mistress now I chase, The first foe in the field; And with a stronger faith embrace A sword, a horse, a shield.

Yet this inconstancy is such As thou too shalt adore; I could not love thee, dear, so much, Loved I not honor more.

IV. Application of the Honor Code Demands Spiritual Selfesteem:

- 1- Development of an honor code in the soul results in a system of integrity based on Bible doctrine.
- 2- It is designed to enable the believer to relate to other believers from a position of personal integrity.
- 3- Integrity in the sense we use the word refers to one's unbending loyalty to the absolute principles of the Word of God.
- 4- One must be convinced that these principles are unchanging and unalterable and represent the expression of divine truth.
- 5- Armed with this knowledge, the Christian individual is able to relate with other believers in a poised and confident manner.
- 6- Assurance that your thoughts, decisions and actions are guided and directed by the thinking of God produces an environment of spiritual self-esteem.
- 7- Spiritual self-esteem thus becomes the basis of resolving problems which emerge from interpersonal relationships.
- 8- The objective of the plan of God is to make you independent of all problems with occur in life through a total dependence on God.
- 9- In order to consistently depend upon God one must be totally convinced that God loves him.
- 10- This confidence is acquired by the systematic inculcation of Bible doctrine which reveals the plan of God to the soul of the individual.
