The Attackers: Reversionists Have a Mind-Set of Evil: Expressed by Human Viewpoint & Human Good; Evil Is Not a Synonym for Sin; Evil Is Lucifer's Strategy to Rule the World; Believers Are Protected "Inside the Bubble"; Sin Removes Them into Carnality; Expressions of Evil: US Supreme Court's Unconstitutional Use of Judicial Restraint & Judicial Activism; Arguments in the Appeal Trial: Lucifer's Efforts to Delay the Second Advent

- 54. From these verses we encounter the mental disposition which produces evil in the souls of men. Several principles regarding this mind-set are important to note:
 - (1) Evil is the policy of Lucifer as the ruler of this world.
 - (2) Evil consists of ideologies that seek to create a system of pseudo good designed to recreate the perfection of Eden or legislate the perfection of the Millennium.
 - (3) Evil is expressed by human viewpoint and human good and embodies all the failed efforts to improve a fallen world absent any dependence on establishment principles or divine viewpoint.
 - (4) Evil is not a synonym for sin. Sin is the violation of a biblical mandate. Evil is the expression of human good that seeks to improve man's environment by means of human intelligence.
 - (5) The most intelligent creature ever created by God is Lucifer who, as a result of the fall of man in the Garden, is presently the ruler of this world.
 - (6) If Lucifer is not capable of ruling this world, then neither can man.
 - (7) Evil is a system of erroneous thought. When it is in ascendency, historical downtrends are in evidence.
 - (8) When evil is left unrestrained and metastasizes in the souls of the people, it results in destruction of the society.
 - (9) Doctrine is the representation of truth expressed by God in Scripture. Evil is the representation of the lie expressed by Lucifer through all other media.
 - (10) This means that the human soul is the battleground on which the angelic conflict is waged.
 - (11) Consequently, there are two categories of thought involved: (1) divine viewpoint is thinking doctrine and (2) human viewpoint is thinking human good and evil.
 - (12) When doctrine is the prime source of thought, the believer is spending maximum time inside the bubble of the divine dynasphere.
 - (13) When evil is the prime source of thought, the believer is spending maximum time inside the labyrinth of the cosmic systems.
 - (14) Sin and evil are not synonymous terms. Recovery from sin is instantaneous through confession alone to God alone as expressed in 1 John 1:9.

- (15) Recovery from evil is a long and arduous process of renovating the soul described in Romans 12:2.
- (16) Evil is expressed in a number of ways. For example, it distorts the laws of divine establishment and is in open opposition to principles of divine viewpoint.
- (17) To steal possessions from another person is a sin; to acquire them through legislative decree is evil.
- (18) Unorthodox sexual behavior is a sin; unorthodox marriage is evil.
- (19) Telling a lie to someone is a sin; to communicate the lie to the masses is evil.
- (20) Evil also encompasses the organized effort to impose human viewpoint on an entire population at the expense of personal freedom and the violation of individual rights.
- (21) This is expressed by ubiquitous government involvement into free enterprise, religion, the economy, gun ownership, medical care, philanthropy, and foreign affairs.
- (22) Evil consists of targeted attacks on God, Christ, the Bible, churches, doctrine, the divine institutions, and traditional standards.
- 23. The arguments in the appeal trial of Lucifer include efforts by the Prosecution to fulfill the four unconditional covenants to Israel and by the defence to establish a man-made Millennium.
- 24. God knows the end from the beginning and has decreed precisely how all of human history will transpire.
- 25. Biblical prophecy is not a look into the future and predicting what will occur, but rather a look back from the future and reporting what does occur.
- 26. The certain fulfillment of these promises make Lucifer's efforts fruitless, therefore the continued pursuit of his strategy is simply a delaying action to postpone his demise as long as possible.
- 27. To do this, his propaganda is directed at the souls of men. It is designed to convince as many as possible that humanitarian efforts are the solutions to man problems.
