## The Soul's Ménage à Trois in James 1:13-15

James 1:13 -Let no one say when he [ personal volition ] is tempted[ present passive participle of #2: πειράζω, peirazō ], "I am being tempted[ present passive indicative ] by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil,and He Himself does not tempt [ present active indicative ] anyone.

<u>v. 14</u> - But each <u>person</u> [ emphasis on volition ] is always <u>tempted</u> [ present <u>passive</u> indicative ] when he is consistently <u>towed about</u> [ static present of #3: ἐξέλκω, *exelkō*: lit: "one boat towing another"; came to mean "to allure": volition is allured ] by means of the <u>lust pattern</u> [ #1: ἐπιθυμία, *epithumia* (feminine gender)] and <u>enticed</u> with bait [ #4: δελεάζω, *deleazō*: "to lure"; "to entice" ].

v. 15 - Then lust, having <u>conceived</u> [#5: συλλαμβάνω, sullambanō</u>: lit: "to receive seed"; aorist tense for a point in time: many cohabiters, few pregnancies; lust (female gender) only becomes sin when its seed is fertilized by negative volition (male gender) ] <u>gives birth to sin</u> [#6: τίκτω ἁμαρτία, tiktō hamartia</u>: sin is delivered: volitional consent ] and sin having been delivered alive consistently <u>gives birth</u> [ static present of ἀποκυέω, apokueō: "to deliver ( out from the womb) ] to <u>death</u> [ #7: θάνατος, thanatos: operational death ].
